

HENRY SPELTER

Henry Spelter is a forestry graduate of the University of Illinois and has a Masters degree in Forest Economics from the University of California-Berkeley.

His career began with the Cook County (Illinois) Forest Preserves after which he spent four years with the consulting firm of Data Resources in Lexington, MA where he was manager of the forest products FORSIM market analysis service.

Subsequently he pursued his career for three decades at the U.S. Forest Products Laboratory in Madison, WI. where he focused on the economics of the lumber and panel industries. Among his contributions were a model for analyzing the demand for lumber, a census of US and Canadian lumber mills by ownership, location and capacity and a study of the nascent wood pellet industry.

Henry's consulting experience included assignments with the Pacific Northwest National Forests, the US International Trade Representative's Office and the Commerce Department where he advised on technical issues related to the US-Canada lumber trade dispute.

Since 2010, Henry has been a Partner with Forest Economic Advisors LLC where he contributes to FEA's Bioenergy and Lumber market analyses.
