

NFBA Building of the Year Award - Entry Rules & Requirements:

Any building designed and erected in a safe manner by a NFBA member builder that utilizes post-frame construction (defined below) in a minimum of 50% of the building structure will be eligible.

Definition: A post-frame building is most clearly defined by its wide column spacing with rafters and/or trusses to create distinct "post frames." Columns may or may not be ground-embedded. Mortise and tendon connections typical of timber frame construction are not considered post frame by this definition.

Buildings must have been completed during December 1, 2023 - November 30, 2025 and be submitted by a current NFBA member in good standing. Any entry found to have been completed prior to December 1, 2023 will forfeit all materials, including the entry fee, submitted to NFBA in the application process.

- It is the obligation of the applicant to check the appropriate box on the entry form to indicate which specific category the building(s) is being entered into.
- To be considered you must complete EACH item on the official entry form.
- Entries received that do not contain all required materials will risk scoring a zero in the respective judging criteria.
- Any NFBA member company is eligible to win.
- All decisions by the judges are final.

Deadline:

All entries must be received at the NFBA office on, or before December 1, 2025.

Entry Fee:

- A separate entry form must be completed for each building submitted
- The entry fee is \$100 and non-refundable. (Refunds will be given for duplicate submissions & payments)



Entry Preparation:

When preparing your entries, consider the quality of your photos. The photos you submit should demonstrate your company's pride in their work.

- Each entry must be accompanied by photos and floor plan(s) to score full points. It is recommended to include:
 - Interior & Exterior photos
 - Photos showing stages of construction
 - At least two views of the completed project
 - A floor plan and cross section of the building. A single-page line drawing equal to or less than 17" x 22" in size is acceptable.
- Entries submitted without photographic support and/or poor photographic prints are unlikely to win the contest.
- Entries submitted without floor plans, blueprints, or drawings are unlikely to win the contest.
- The person submitting the entry form(s) MUST sign a photo release that gives NFBA the right to publish photos of the submission.
- Remodel/Retrofit category entries must submit before and after photos.

How to Submit Entry Form & Supporting Documents

- <u>Digital Submission</u>: Log into the NFBA 'Members Only' section to submit your entry form(s) online. Directions will also be posted for uploading photos and supporting documents. Email awards@nfba.org if you have questions.

Winners:

- Winners will be notified at least 1 month prior to the annual NFBA Conference & Expo.
 Winners will be responsible for notifying NFBA if they plan to have a representative attend the Awards Luncheon to accept their award.
- Winners will receive 2 complimentary tickets to the Awards Luncheon (2 per winning submission). Winners will be responsible for notifying NFBA as to who should receive those complimentary tickets.
 - Luncheon tickets are first come first serve. Winners that fail to notify NFBA in a timely manner will still be able to attend the ceremony, but may not be served lunch due to limited availability.
- All Building of the Year Winners will be displayed during the Awards luncheon, and will be posted on the NFBA website and social media.
- All entries will be considered for the prestigious Judges' Award

Application & Scoring Info

The 2025 Building of the Year contest consists of 30 award categories plus a Judges' Award.

NFBA's redesigned awards program allows builder member companies to compete against builder member companies of comparable size. Each of the 10 main award categories have three divisions:

- (1) EXPERTS Builders who have an estimated \$0-3 million in annual gross volume.
- (2) MASTERS Builders who have an estimated \$3-6 million in annual gross volume.
- (3) PREMIER Builders who have an estimated \$6+ million in annual gross volume.

NFBA reserves the right to move or disqualify entries that are submitted to the wrong division. Winners in the three divisions of all categories receive equal recognition and benefits.



Categories & Descriptions

Agricultural Storage & Livestock Facilities

Buildings used predominantly for agricultural activity or housing livestock.

Barndominiums

Buildings with living space and garage/animal space, <u>must have 50% or more of non-residential housing.</u>

Commercial Retail

Single-use buildings conducting retail for consumer business, such as: Retail stores, garden centers, farm stands, & restaurants.

Commercial Business / Industrial

Buildings for mixed use commercial business, such as: Workshops, offices, & warehouses.

Hobby Shops

Private Buildings that support an owner or group's hobby, collection, and/or activities.

Horse Barns

Buildings used for housing or other equine activities, including stall barns and arenas.

Institutional / Public Non-Profit Buildings

Churches, schools, nonprofit organization offices, government buildings, fire stations, community centers, and all other public-use buildings.

Residential Homes

Buildings with living space, including more than 50% for residential housing.

Retrofitted / Remodeled Buildings

Renovations of existing post-frame buildings, or post-frame additions to existing buildings.

Suburban Garages

Detached post-frame residential style garage for personal storage use. Under 2,000 Sq. Ft.

*Note: The judges reserve the right to move an entry into a category that is, in their view, a better fit for the entry.

Judges' Award

Participants may not submit entries for the Judges' Award. The judges will select an exceptional entry that they believe deserves special recognition. All entries will be considered for the Judges' Award.
